A"GRAETER" PLACE TO MEET

This week, thousands of Free Will Baptists will flood Cincinnati, Ohio, for the 83rd convention of the National Association of Free Will Baptists. With more than 3,000 pre-registered, convention planners anticipate a great turnout as Free Will Baptists gather in Duke Energy Convention Center to worship, fellowship, carry out denominational business, and vote on a new executive secretary.

About Cincinnati

Known originally as Losantiville (an unpopular name that didn't last long), Cincinnati was settled in 1789. The convenient location on the banks of the Ohio River led to rapid expansion, and Cincinnati soon became the county seat. As time passed, the city became a center for trade. Cincinnati soon became the largest city in Ohio and the most densely populated city in the U.S.

Today, Cincinnati remains the largest metropolitan center in Ohio and continues to grow. Many large corporations call it home: Proctor and Gamble, Kroger, Chiquita Brands, G.E. Aviation, Macy's, and Fifth-Third Bank, among others.

Cincinnati is also well-known for the ingenuity of its citizens. The city was home to the first municipal fire department (1853), the first air mail system (by hot-air balloon, 1835), and the first concrete high rise building (1902). And, most important to some, the city is also credited with the invention of the hot dog. Here are a few suggestions to enjoy all Cincinnati has to offer:

Impacting Cincy

Too often, cities remember Christian meetings for all the wrong reasons. Convention Manager Ryan Lewis offers some easy tips to make the convention a positive experience for everyone—attendees and city workers:

For the City

- + Tip valets (going and coming is common in Cincy).
- + Tip servers (15% or 20% for a group).
- + Be quiet in your hotel after 10 p.m.
- + Be smart. Don't walk alone after dark; limit cash.
- + Tip your maid (not expected but always appreciated).

For the Convention

- + Pray for convention speakers and personnel.
- + Attend worship services.
- + Smile...even when standing in lines.
- + Attend one of the 84 seminars or workshops offered.
- + Cheer on kids at the CTS Expo (not necessarily your kids).
- + Attend business sessions.
- + Meet a missionary or church planter. (Better yet, take one out for coffee.)
- + Get to know a national leader.
- + Thank someone from Ohio. Hosting is hard work.

Graeter's Ice Cream

Located on Walnut Street, Graeter's Ice Cream has been family owned since 1868, starting with Louis Graeter and his wife Regina and continuing for four generations. The couple began selling ice cream out of their home. As the story goes, their young son sneaked some chocolate from his mother and poured it into a pot of ice cream, inventing the signature "chocolate chunks." Cincinnati Zoo

The Zoological Society of Cincinnati was founded in 1873 and officially opened in 1875, making Cincinnati Zoo the second oldest in the United States. The original collection of animals was very small: eight monkeys, two grizzly bears, three deer, six raccoons, two elk, a buffalo, a hyena, a tiger, an alligator, a circus elephant, and 400 birds (continued, page 2)

Changes for CTS Expo

The last five years have seen much change for CTS. For example, the National Youth Conference became the Vertical Three Conference, and competitive activities were renamed CTS Ministry Expo. As much as things have changed, however, the mission of CTS remains the same: to help students identify and develop God-given abilities for use in serving Him and His church.

Changes continue for the CTS Expo in 2020. A new *Guidelines* book containing these changes has been released by Randall House and is available at RandallHouse.com or firebox.verticalthree.com. Some of the changes include removal of the tie requirement for young men, a cost adjustment per event, and the addition of a new exhibition event: Special Needs. Bible Millionaire returns to its single elimination format, and two categories, Commercial and Infomercial, have been merged into a single category: Video Production. This year, Randall House added a "changelog" to the *Guidelines* identifying changes from the prior version.
